

## **Floor Loading**

### **(Floor strengths in relation to the weights of snooker tables)**

It is a common misconception that floors need to be specially strengthened to support the weight of full size snooker tables. In fact, the actual floor loading over the area involved is very low.

The total weight of the biggest snooker table (Full- Size) is unlikely to exceed 1250kg

The table stands on several legs so the incident loading is divided up over each leg

This equates to 0.36 kgs/sq cm

### **... Or approximately 15 people standing in the room**

**A 6ft snooker table** would equate to approximately 7.5x 10-stone men standing in your room

**A 7ft snooker table** would equate to approximately 9.5 x 10-stone men standing in your room

**A 8ft snooker table** would equate to approximately 10.5 x 10- stone men standing in your room

**A 9ft snooker table** would equate to approximately 11.5 x 10- stone men standing in your room

**A 10ft snooker table** would equate to approximately 12.5 x 10- stone men standing in your room

**A 12ft snooker table** would equate to approximately 15 x 10- stone men standing in your room
